


Welcome Onboard



Independence of Herm, a spacious MOODY 64 with guest accommodation comprises of three guest cabins. The impressive master stateroom is located aft with sofas either side of the large double bed. There is plenty of storage space and an excellent en suite bathroom. There is a 15" LCD flat screen TV, recessed behind the mirror. To port is a navigation /office area, and amidships is the beautifully appointed saloon with galley area to starboard. Forward there is one double guest VIP cabin and a

twin cabin, both with it's own have bathrooms. Crew quarters for two with bathroom in the forward.



Itinerary Mallorca 7 days



- This Itinerary is made by our experienced Captain who done this trip several times, we propose and recommend this route but of course your inputs is of high value for us if you want to change anything, add a day in one place and remove another bay. Before you come onboard we tailor it to your expectations and ones onboard we decide any changes along the way on a day to day bases.

Day 1: Arrive the center of Palma de Mallorca. The Marina Real Club Nautico just located near the Cathedral and Santa Catalina which now is a metropolis for wining and dining. After settle in we will head for our first destination, Es Trenc. From Palma we cross SE toward Cala Pi and head E to Es Trenc. This leg is 23NM and we should be there 3 hours later and anchor in crystal clear water or at the Marina of San Carlos de Sa Ràpita



Day 1: Except white beach and crystal clear waters and a land set of a very Mediterranean nature. A coast line with several beaches and easy to find a spot for our self. Visitors are fascinated by the beauty here, the sparkling white beaches out on the deep blue sea. Ses Covetes beach offers a variety of grilled food and the evenings offers live music.



Day 2: Cala Figuera, This is a short leg, 15NM and 2 hours sailing. A leg we can do before breakfast and make a stop in Es Caragol beach and have our breakfast here. Not so many people comes here as its not so easy to reach from land. When we set sail again we will pass through four of the most spectacular coves on the island. Cala Marmols, Cala s'Almunia, Caló des Moro and Cala Llombards. Coves, rock, forests and crystal clear waters, that is an amazing land set to. Drop anchor and enjoy mother nature.





Day 3: We continue on the east side to Cala Vaquers and Cala Sa Nau or if you wish to stop in the town Port Colom. A leg of 22NM (3h) depending on where we stop. First we sail towards Mondragó, a natural park, another of Mallorca natural beauties and for the keen hiker a heaven. In Cala S'Amarador lets enjoy a swim and snorkeling in its crystal clear waters. When we are ready, we continue to Cala Varques.

Cala Varques is pretty much untouched and un spoilt. On land, surrounded by a imperial forest and a great place for snorkeling. In the early evening we will head for Cala Sa Nau, a very protected natural port to anchor in.



Day 4: After breakfast we have a leg of 23NM (3.5h). New course to SW to Cabrera. The National Park of Cabrera a must place to visit while on a boat in Mallorca. An archipelago consisting of 19 islands, is one of the most beautiful natural parks in Spain, a peaceful place to just relax in. Some say it's the clearest water in the whole med, judge for you self and jump in and discover the marine life. When temperatures goes down take a hiking in the forest. Cabrera has an interesting history. The island became a natural French prisoners of the war of Independence, who were abandoned to their fate. Worth reading about on the web. Also check the castle and the blue cave. Cabrera has a safe natural ports and with the permit from Park Office you are allowed to anchor here.



Day 5: A day we should start early with a leg of 30NM (5h) to Cala del Mago. Enjoy the sailing or just relax with a good book and let the crew do the job. Dolphins are quite common here so with some luck you will see them jumping in front of the yacht.

Cala del Mago and the Portals Vells is stunning. Needless to say the water quality is crys....

The Cathedral of Palma was built by stones from the cave. The cove a good spot for anchorage and if you wish to dine outside there are some local food on the beach at the coves.



Day 6: A short leg of 15NM 8(2h) to Sa Dragonera. The Natural Park of Sa Dragonera is an extension of the Sierra de Tramontana and located at Sant Elm, a small fishing village that brings you back in the older days.

If weather conditions are good anchorage is perfect here or we can take shelter in port of Andratx if to windy.

A relaxing day at anchor here is stunning but if you feel for some party you will find several clubs near here or just relax and watch the sun go down in the horizon.







Day 7: Last leg back to Palma where we will spend the night unless you wish for another relax full day in a quiet beach. You decide if you wish an evening with Palmas best night life and restaurants serving food from all over the world. Santa Catalina is worth a visit but mostly guests enjoys the life at sea when it's the best and return to port in the early morning for disembarkation. Let the crew do an early return and wake up in the marina. Lets decide the last day.
